4:40	Chief Lavey, Meridian Police Department: Legislative Updates	 Chief Lavey: Legislation has been different this year in relation to others. The attempt to make it an infraction for marijuana use instead of misdemeanor is not passing. Senator Heider helped lead the opposition to CBD oil. The legislative leadership is in support of Heider's decision. A CBD bill will be back next legislative session. Preemptive City ordinance was discussed between the Chief and Council President as an option, had this CBD bill passed. Mayor Tammy is the Chair of the Drug Task Force for Association of Idaho Cities. The Mayor and a few others are strategizing on what this drug task force will focus on. We are looking at opioids and marijuana. Kendall will be a part of this group as well. Our goal is to instill the wisdom and passion that MADC has onto others within the state.

Our mission is to strengthen our community through substance abuse prevention. Our vision is to build Meridian into a drug free community where people can safely live, work and raise a family.
