MANAGER QUESTION OF THE QUARTER:

'If a resident dies in our apartments, we contact 911 right away. Should we then call their emergency contact or next of kin, or should the police make that call?'

If a resident were to pass away in one of your units, contact 911 right away, stay out of the resident's unit, and wait for first responders to arrive. In most cases, the Coroner's office will respond and take over the investigation.

During this time, it is important to keep confidentiality in mind. Leave it up to law enforcement personnel to notify their emergency contact or next of kin.

>>> SWIMMING SAFETY

Swimming is the best way to beat the heat during the warm, summer months and most apartment communities have swimming pools.

Follow the tips below to make sure you and your children are staying safe:

- Never swim alone.
- Learn CPR and basic first aid.
- Keep the pool free of too many toys and floaties.
- Get children into swim at an early age.
- An adult should always provide constant, undistracted supervision in and out of the water.
- Always have children who cannot swim on their own use a proper, cost guard approved, personal flotation device.

» NOISE COMPLAINTS

With warmer weather, noise levels may increase with more residents outside or having family and friends over.

It is the property management's responsibility to handle noise complaints. It is important to educate residents on when to call management versus non-emergency dispatch.

Residents can call **non-emergency dispatch (208-377-6790)** if the noise level is disturbing their peace and continues to occur after talking with their property manager.
