3:05	<ul> <li>Kendall Nagy, MADC Director</li> <li>Action Planning</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Begin creating action plan for new strategies:</li> <li>1) Provide annual training for West Ada admin and teachers prior to school year beginning: <ul> <li>Kendall has spoken with Dawn Tolan to develop a training that would help foster those relationships with the SRO's. The SRO Sgt. Thinks this is a great idea. Timeline would be sometime in August. This would be roughly three hours of training and free of charge. Trends, signs of use, specific drugs.</li> <li>Ternel: Talk with Dawn to find out what specific drugs she wants the SRO to talk about. Some other suggestions would be how youth conceal drugs and how K9's work</li> <li>Earl: Another topic could be how it's concealed in vehicles and what that looks like.</li> <li>Kendall: We could supply paraphernalia examples to show the teachers as well.</li> <li>Esmeralda: Train the teachers how to approach a student, parents, and the surrounding circle of the students.</li> <li>Ternel: Have the first responders experts discuss what they see with youth and drugs. For example symptoms of overdoses. Some stats would be a good addition as well.</li> <li>Earl: Has multiple resources that could talk as well.</li> <li>Kendall: Dawn will help guide the topics that we would focus on, and then have a panel that could answer questions and discuss topics.</li> <li>Bethany: Has a physician that would be willing to present as well.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

3) Youth Treatment Scholarship Program:
• Bethany will look into estimates on how much treatment is locally for youth and duration of treatment.

• Earl: Maybe if we get an idea of how much insurance covers, it could give us an idea of how much to
offer.
• Kendall: We could work with specific treatment centers to build partnerships, and have those be
specific on the scholarship applications.
• Ternel: Pick top three treatment centers, based on a variety of things including cost.
Bethany: Currently there are two or three treatment facilities for youth. Intermountain, Port of Hope,
Ascent.
4)Additional K9 in schools:
• This is a projected two year plan. We will have time to further discuss this in the future.
5) Protect Meridian from marijuana legalization, preemptive city ordinance:
